### President Tom's Column

Guess What? There's another new guy on the block. Relax you only have to hear from me three more times in 2007. Speaking of 2007, may you all enjoy a happy and prosperous New Year in this great organization of retired men, called Sons In Retirement, Inc.

You may wonder why we have so many rules, and you may also wonder why do we have Area Governors, Regional Directors, a State Board, and State Committees? The answers are that we have to comply with the legal requirements of a non-profit public benefit corporation in the State of California, of which there are many. This requires some oversight. We also provide our members with some activities and events to give you something to get involved in.

Some of you may wonder what does the State Organization of SIR do for us at the Branch level? Since this column is limited, I will only tell you a few things we do for our members and Branches:

- 1. The State SIR files annually with the California Secretary of State and the Attorney General to maintain our non-profit status. The State also pays on behalf of each Branch a \$10 filing fee each year.
- 2. The State SIR files Income Tax Returns annually on behalf of our Branches with the Internal Revenue Service and the State Board of Equalization.
- 3. The State SIR conducts three regular State Board Meetings each year, the Annual Meeting on the first Monday of August and numerous State Committee meetings to exchange information, keep our Bylaws and Rules current, and to provide our members with State activities and events.
- 4. The State SIR, through its Information Systems Committee, provides the members and Branches with a ton of information on the SIR Website, <a href="www.sirinc.org">www.sirinc.org</a>, including its quarterly publication of SIR Happenings.
- 5. State SIR pays around \$68 to \$70 thousand dollars a year in liability insurance premiums. Our corporate status along with our third–party liability insurance is designed to protect our Branch and State Officers in the event we are sued.

All of the foregoing is paid for by the quarterly pro-rata amount assessed each active member by the State SIR. Where else can one obtain the above services for \$4.60 per year?

### Palmer Craig Receives President's Award at age 103

San Jose resident, *Palmer Craig*, was recently honored with the President's Senior Service Award at the age of 103, after having served as a member of Sons In Retirement for an incredible 34 years... his age and years as an active member of SIR, could well be a record for the organization.

Palmer, who celebrated his birthday in January, was a charter member of the Villages Branch 38 and later became a charter member of Branch 114, when it was formed.

He graduated from the University of Delaware with a degree in Electrical Engineering and joined the Westinghouse Electric Company, where he designed a radio powered by alternating current, instead of batteries. He moved on to RCA and later joined the Philco Corporation, where he remained for 36 years.

Palmer and his wife were together for almost 60 years when she passed away. He admits to a few concessions considering his age... he no longer drives a car nor a golf cart; he relies on a talking calculator to tell him the time; and he microwaves dinners prepared by his housekeepers.

No matter his age, at 5 foot 10 inches, Palmer Craig is still an impressive figure and an honor to our organization.

# Pearl Harbor Survivor Joe Bigham, Bulletin Editor

Many members of SIR weren't even born when *Joe Ruggles* joined the Navy in 1931.

Service life was peaceful until December 7, 1941, when Ruggles found himself "right in the middle of things" during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor... "I got an ambulance out and started picking up people and putting them on the lawn," recalls



Ruggles, who was a chief pharmacist mate. "The hospital didn't have enough room and the worst part were the burn cases... we tried to ease their pain with shots of morphine."

Ruggles spent 24 years in the Navy – through World war II and Korea – before retiring in 1955. For a long time, he wouldn't talk about the day America entered World War II... "I can talk about it now," he says, but "I didn't want to talk about it for about 15-20 years."

Ruggles joined Sons in Retirement in Walnut Creek, then transferred to Branch 179 in Fresno 2 ½ years ago to be near his daughter. Ruggles was 95 in December and was honored as the branch's oldest member.

Aside from December 7, Ruggles' most traumatic service experience was on Okinawa, two months after the war ended... "We lost 129 ships in a typhoon on October 9, 1945," he says.

Gene will replace Vic Longo as our Treasurer and Don will replace John Gisler as a member of the Policy Sub-Committee. **SIR golf flourished in 2006:** We were pleased with the overall participation last year in our golf events, especially with the interest in Reno, the State Team Scramble Championship, Poppy Hills and the Mexico trips. While neither Las Vegas nor Solvang sold out, both were well-attended and have been scheduled again for 2007. We will continue to pay close attention to the process of announcing the availability of applications for our most popular tournaments, in order to give every SIR an equal opportunity to apply in a timely manner.

**2007 State Golf Tournament Schedule:** The following events have been approved by the State Board. The application for the two **Las Vegas** weeks in March is already available on the SIR website. Please note that the second week in LV includes an extra day between the 2nd and 3rd rounds of golf (your feedback told us to try this on one of the Vegas weeks). If both Las Vegas weeks go well, we may do it again next year.

The applications for **Reno** will be made available in early March. The dates are set: June 11–15 and June 18–22. The **Scramble Team Championship** will occur on August 21st at **Poppy Ridge** in Livermore. Area qualifiers for this event should take place in June. **Solvang** is scheduled for September 9–13. The **Individual State Championship and Open Play at Poppy Hills** will take place on November 5th and 6th. Area and Division qualifiers for this championship will occur in May and August, respectively.

**Mexico dates** are tentatively set for October 24–31 and November 7–14. We are receiving proposals from two different sources (Golden Gate Tours and International Leisure Tours); one is bidding on Mazatlan, and the other on Ixtapa and Mazatlan. We may be able to offer both trips to our members. The results of our recent surveys, collected at Poppy Hills, Puerta Vallarta and on the Dawn Princess Cruise will influence the committee decision on the desired location.


