

# President Buck's Challenge



I have been very encouraged by many of the branch reactions to the 10% recruitment goal that was set by the Board. Early results from the Form 27 reports and some of the quarterly reports, indicate that the process is working and several branches have already met their recruitment goal for the year, while others are ahead of pace for meeting it. We don't yet have enough information to know if we have leveled off the membership

loss trends, but I have confidence in the results of the "Pro-Active" leadership of our Directors and Governors. I have to note that not all of our branches have willingly agreed to participate and the leadership team has encountered some "push back." It is my goal that all the branches adopt the process and regain their healthy membership levels. Most of the reports from the participating branches praise the process and acknowledge that it really focuses their attention on their membership issues in ways they never had before.

I am pleased to announce that the State RV Activity has been reactivated under the leadership of Committee Co-Chairmen Don Cummings (Branch 7) and Jack Streckfus (Branch 22). They are in the process of staffing their committee and developing plans for future RV activities. I am personally appreciative of their willingness to step up to the challenges and I look forward to joining them on some exciting RV outings.

In a volunteer organization like SIR, there are many functions and activities that are performed by members without formal recognition or appreciation. Many times we do not even know what an individual is contributing until one day that person is no longer able to continue due to illness or changes in their life situation. I just recently became aware of how much Gary Gruber was really doing for SIR, when he announced he was selling his home in South Lake Tahoe and moving to the Houston area to be near one of his daughters. He had backed away from his Secretarial duties earlier in the year due to his serious illness, but he had continued to work from home doing all the "unofficial" tasks that he did in addition. - Provide to SIR clubs and SIR members, information provided to the SIR State RV Committee regarding special rates or offers made by campgrounds, RV stores, RV service providers, etc.
- Plan an RV get-acquainted mixer where SIR members with RVs can get to know other SIR members.
- Use SIR RV clubs as a recruiting tool for getting new members into SIR.
- Seek information with photos from SIR RV Clubs about their outings, so they can be included in RV informational email bulletins and published in SIR Happenings.

Don and Jack will be working in the coming months to add interested SIR members to the RV Committee. 
# The Annual Meeting of Sons In Retirement

# Happenings at the State Board Meeting Excerpts from the minutes of the June 2010 State Board Meeting

**President Kendrick**, in his introductory comments, complying with the Travel Code, especially in the was pleased to announce that Branch 35 has taken in 35 new members through May. Speaking for Vice President Mannell, Kendrick indicated that he has come up with a plan for mementos to be given to attendees at the August 2nd Annual Meeting. He then made some comments on items that would be coming up later in the meeting.

Assistant Secretary Hal Stephens reported that he would be processing the final set of Forms SI-100 for the year 2010. He also spoke about the badges that are available from Arnolds for Awards, and stated that the company is going to be recognized in an upcoming issue of SIR Happenings.

Assistant Treasurer Karl Ryden, reporting for Treasurer Mike Berry, stated that the State financial reports as of May 31st have been published and distributed. Basically, income is down and expenses are up, except insurance premiums are down.

G & M Member Stedman presented a detailed report on the implementation of the new Form 27 Branch Membership Report. 45% of the Branches have submitted the report and he is pleased with what the reported figures reflect. The instructions for the form will be simplified. He encouraged the Regional Directors to help him secure reports from every Branch.

Regional Directors each gave a report on the goings-on in his Region, mainly emphasizing membership and endeavors to maintain and increase membership counts.

Nominating Committee Chairman Reiser offered the slate of nominees for the 2011 Elected Officers, to be voted on at the August Annual Meeting.

Publicity & Tools Chairman Schick spoke on behalf of Growth and Management Chairman Hubinger and referred the Board to a report prepared by the committee chairman covering some of the projects the committee is working on. He also talked about some of the things his new committee is doing and referred members to the written report he had prepared.

InfoSys Chairman Dwight Sale led a discussion about the growing pains associated with getting Branches to implement the database program.

Travel Chairman Garvin reported that he is experiencing the old problem with Branches not submission of the proper forms to the State Travel Committee.

Training Committee Chairman Stedman outlined his plans for the October 2010 Training Session. Regional Directors, Area Governors and Big Sirs will be required to attend. The Branch Leaders Guide is being expanded to include all three groups and will be renamed "State Leaders Guide."

Rules Committee Chairman Smith presented some proposed rules changes and they were approved.

President Kendrick led a discussion of the mementos to be given out at the Annual Meeting and a motion to approve the cost was passed. Kendrick indicated he wanted to re-activate the RV Committee and covered some of the issues that needed to be addressed. A motion to re-activate the RV Committee was passed. He introduced a proposal to offer a Certificate of Membership to the Branches, available from the SIR Forms Page on the website. He showed a draft of the certificate and after discussion, a motion was passed to approve implementation of the certificate.

In his concluding remarks, President Kendrick said we have much work to do in the second half of the year to reach the 10% membership goal in all the Branches. He said he feels that many Branches are still operating the way they always have, which can lead to failure and encouraged the leadership to help the Branches adopt new ideas that work and also revitalize their activities to improve the health and vitality of the Branches and increase membership.
